Exploring Ethical Issues Through Sandtray Therapy

with Daniel Sweeney

This experiential workshop will explore ethical theories, models, and codes relevant to the practice of Sandtray Therapy. There will be a focus on exploring and understanding a specific ethical decision-making model, with applications to the sandtray therapy process. Emphasis will be given to aspects of the Association for Play Therapy Practice Guidelines and the Sandplay Therapists of America Standards for Professional Conduct. Using case examples and vignettes, attendees will explore various legal and ethical decisions and actions. Exploration of ethical challenges will include experiential sandtray exercises. Attendees should plan on bringing 25-30 sandtray miniature figures.

OBJECTIVES

Identify and explain a practical model for ethical decision-making in sandtray therapy

Identify key elements of the Association for Play Therapy Practice Guidelines and the Sandplay

Therapists of America Standards for Professional Conduct

Identify the unique ethical challenges that commonly exist in the practice of sandtray therapy.

Describe common ethical mistakes of sandtray therapists.

Identify methods of self-care, for purposes of maintaining professionalism as a sandtray therapist, and if confronted by a client or board complaint.

List at least three implications for sandtray therapy practice.

Sandtray Therapy Through a Trauma-informed Lens

with Linda Homeyer

This workshop will provide play therapists an exploration of trauma-informed dynamics to ones' ongoing clinical work, counseling/personality theory, and client conceptualization. The focus will be understanding what trauma work looks like in the sand tray; how the sand tray facilitates healing with trauma work. This includes use and importance of the "trauma narrative," "life narrative," and "family narrative" in successful treatment. The value of the family narrative and family script regarding the traumatic event will be discussed. Case studies and examples will be given. Participants: Please bring 15-20 miniature figures; some which represent trauma, and some, healing. We will experience and play, too!

OBJECTIVES

Identify how using sand, sand tray, and miniature figures can assist client's ability to co-regulate with the play therapist.

List trauma-related miniature figures, both symbols of fear and symbols of safety.

Assess and use spiritual/religious issues as a resiliency factor in trauma treatment.

Discuss trauma, impact of ACE studies, and trauma-informed practice in play therapist use of sand tray.

List the three steps of trauma work and application to sandtray therapy within the play therapy milieu.

She received APT's Lifetime Achievement Award in October 2013 and Director Emerita in 2016. Dr. Homeyer has co-authored four books on play therapy as well as many book chapters and journal articles.



Daniel Sweeney PhD, LPC, LMFT, ACS, RPT-S



Daniel is the founder and director of the Northwest Center for Play Therapy Studies. He is also a tenured professor of counseling and Clinical Director of the Marriage, Couple and Family Counseling program in the Graduate School of Counseling at George Fox University. Dr. Sweeney is a former member of the board of directors and past-president of the Association for Play Therapy, a registered play therapist-supervisor (RPT-S) and maintains a small private practice.

Georgia Mann

Georgia is a popular artist of handmade ceramic figures for Sandplay therapists & other play therapies for over 25 years. Since the early 90's she has been creating uplifting figures of Archetypal images, qualities of Divine Feminine, positive male, and couples relating to life's transitions.
